It's easy to find campground, beet harvest, and Amazon Camperforce ads in Workamper News. But, every once in a while, you will come across something unusual listed in the Hotline Jobs or bi-monthly magazine ads - like traveling to shows, expos, and fairs to sell a cooking system or renting out mobility scooters at events like the New York State Fair. We always wondered what it would be like to travel to different expos and work at a booth. This past summer, we got our chance.

Many Types of Expo Jobs

There are a lot of different jobs that go into making an expo, fair, or other event happen. Some folks run their booths and sell their wares. Others are in charge of security, maintenance, setup and takedown, or food service. (You have probably seen the ads in Workamper News for food service workers at the Houston Rodeo.)

In our expo experience, Natalie and I were hired to run a booth for Jackery. This company specializes in manufacturing portable power stations, which are basically a lithium battery pack, inverter, and a solar charge controller - all wrapped in an easy-to-carry box.

Getting the Job

About 90% of our Workamping jobs have been found using Workamper News, but this was an exception as we had a previous relationship with the company via our freelance copywriting services. So, we weren't actually looking for the gig. It was offered to us because we knew the product well.

Traditionally though, if you see an ad for this type of job and enjoy interacting with people or have some past sales experience, it probably isn't too hard to land a gig. Especially if you can travel from event to event and invest in some of the upfront costs necessary to do the job. (Not all require upfront costs.)

The Agreement

There are a lot of different ways to get paid during expos. Food service workers and other employees are usually paid hourly, but if you are working a booth, payment could be based on the number of hours worked, commission, base pay plus bonuses, and any combination of the three. It's essential to consider the pay structure for a job and weigh your costs to potential earnings to decide if it's a good deal.

Jackery offered to reimburse us for fuel traveling to each event, RV park lodging, and food costs during the event. They also reimbursed us for any supplies we needed to get for the events.

They went with a base pay/commission/bonus model. It looked like a good deal, and we couldn't find a scenario that resulted in us losing money regardless of how the event went. So, we signed a contract and prepared to head to Utah for the first expo.

Booking The Show

When it came to signing up to participate in a show, Jackery took care of booking and paying for the booth. This had its advantages and disadvantages. On one hand, all we had to do was drive to the location and set up. On the other hand, the show organizers sent their communications and updates to the person who booked the booth. We weren't always in the loop with the latest updates. This resulted in some surprises when showing up.

For example, we arrived at our first show with both the company and us thinking there would be a canopy and tables. We arrived to find out that, due to miscommunication, neither was ordered. Our booth at that point was a patch of grass with some power stations. We had 12 hours to acquire two large canopies and find a way to weigh it down in the specific manner required by the event rules.

Accommodations

Overall, we did three events for Jackery.

- The Overlander Expo in Salt Lake City, UT
- The Family Motorcoach Association (FMCA) Rally in Gillette, WY
- Another Overlander Expo in Loveland, CO

Accommodations for events varied wildly. For example, vendors for the FMCA event were offered

a full hookup site at the fairgrounds next door to the event center. In comparison, the Overland Expo in Colorado provided some dry camping for smaller rigs at the event site, but those with larger RVs who wanted hookups had to find a spot at the few nearby RV parks available. We luckily got a spot that was only about 15 minutes away as some were over an hour away.

For two of the three events, it was up to us to secure a place to stay during the expos. What we quickly learned was the importance of booking as early as possible, especially because every other vendor and customer at the event was trying to get a spot too.

The Expos

All of the expos worked pretty much the same way for vendors. Once we arrived, we checked in at the event center and were directed to our spot. However, Jackery always forwarded the event schedule and details ahead of time.

Setup

The "booth" was generally just a marked-off square with tape or marker paint. The vendor was in charge of setting up their station; however, the organizers offered booth upgrade options which could include canopies, carpets, tables, drapes, etc. It was always more expensive than bringing your own supplies.

During The Event

Plan on talking a lot! (Natalie lost her voice halfway through the second expo.) Thousands of people show up over several days at these events. The good news: we pretty much had our talking points down by the end of the first day. However, we realized just how exhausting it was to interact with hundreds of people for three to four days straight.

Take Down

The crowd dwindled quickly on the last day at every event, and the takedown went pretty smoothly. Those who spent the extra money to have the event handle their canopy and tables had it even easier since they just grabbed their stuff and headed out.

What We Learned

If you are thinking about trying out a traveling gig like this one for yourself, consider some of the following lessons we learned:

1. Projecting profit is not easy if paid on commissions and bonuses.

Shows put out an estimated amount of attendees, but that number is a guess. If you are just starting out, it's hard to project the crowd's interest in your product. One show we did was just not the right demographic for the product. The list goes on, but the point is, if you are planning your first show, predicting how well it's going to go has too many variables.

It's always good to visualize and prepare for a fantastic show, but don't let it bring you down if it wasn't what you were expecting. We made the base pay in our first two shows because the turnout was much less than anticipated. But since our travel expenses were covered, we didn't lose money. The last show was a huge success and included a nice little bonus for us!

2. You can save money in between shows by boondocking.

It was generally several weeks between shows, so we decided to boondock in the interim, something we had wanted to try out for longer than an overnight or couple-day stint. Campendium.com







became our constant resource as we boondocked our way to the next event.

We stayed in some beautiful locations, and in many cases, we were the only ones there for days. On occasion, we stayed next to lakes and woke up to wild horses, antelope, and cows. The night sky was stunning in the often out-of-the-way places we parked for days at a time.

3. Boondocking for three months can get old.

Too much of a good thing can be bad. Picking up camp every four to five days to dump our tanks or travel to a new location

for three months straight became exhausting. This was especially true in the 90+ degree heat of summer. The only way to keep temps from reaching dangerous levels for us and the pets was to run our generator 6+ hours a day.

4. Plan on being exhausted.

An expo is kind of a whirlwind of setup, performing and talking with hundreds of people a day for 3+ days, and then packing it all up and driving to the next location.

5. Many expenses are tax-deductible.

If you are working as an independent contractor, many expenses, including food, travel, and materials are tax-deductible. Save your receipts and talk to whoever does your taxes about what is and isn't deductible.

6. You may need to get permits & insurance.

If you sell physical items at your booth, most shows require you to get special tax permits to sell in that state, county, and sometimes the city. Vendors may also need to acquire liability insurance covering things like personal injury, property damage, and more. If you are representing a company, they may take care of these things for you, but as an independent contractor, you will have to contact the relevant offices and get them yourself.

We, fortunately, were giving customers a discount code to use at Jackery.com. Since we didn't have a physical product to sell, we didn't have to worry about obtaining the proper permits. The downside was a decrease in sales, moreso with crowds that didn't want to wait for the product to be shipped to them or weren't particularly tech-savvy enough to order online.



7. You get to travel a lot.

Many people become full-time RVers to travel more, and when your job requires you to be in a new state every month, you definitely get around.

From our starting point in Westport, WA, to getting back to our original travel plans after the third event, we went through 8 states and traveled almost 3,000 miles in three months.

8. We discovered it wasn't for us.

We had fun doing the events and exploring the beautiful boondocking locations. We also really loved telling people about Jackery. It's a great product to have for boondocking or power outages.


But for us, the constant travel and stresses of the event prep, along with carrying around an entire booth setup with demo units in our 26-foot rig, just wasn't our style of RVing.

That's What Makes Workamping Great!

People Workamp because it gives them freedom to explore new places, people, and new jobs. Most Workamping jobs only last a season or less. If you decide that a job isn't for you, Workamper News has a hundred more across various categories to choose from next season, and Hotline Jobs come in all the time, often offering gigs you could start right away.

We are still copywriters for Jackery and love their product. Since we informed them after our last show that the expo scene just wasn't for us, it made way for other folks who travel full-time in a van to take over. They ran a booth at the Quartzite show this past January.

As for us, we're checking the Hotline Jobs page on Workamper News for our next Workamping adventure.

ome people may be interested in The Workamping lifestyle, but are reluctant to jump in with both feet by buying an RV just to see if they'll like the experience. Have no fear! You can still enjoy a memorable, seasonal adventure.

It's infrequent to see employers offering unique accommodations, but every issue of Workamper News usually has at least four opportunities where housing is provided. In fact, some offer food as well.

For most employers, the big benefit to hiring Workampers is that they bring their homes with them. It's also relatively easy for employers to create a fullhookup RV site with water, electricity and sewer connections. Yet, some worksites do have homes, apartments, and dorm facilities available.

Generally, those accommodations are used by college students and foreign workers. But, Workampers can often utilize them as well.

Let's explore why employers may make the accommodations available and look at several companies which offered housing as a benefit at some

point in the past year. Keep in mind that and from event to event. Scootaround most of these employers also welcome Workampers who have their own RVs.

Scooting Around to Hotels or AirBnB Homes

Scootaround can provide lodging for people helping out at various fairs, festivals, and car shows around the country where they would rent scooters, wheelchairs, strollers, and wagons. Workampers would set up the booth, prep equipment, and facilitate rentals.

Most of the company's Workampers are couples, but the firm employs solos, too. The type of lodging available depends upon the event and its duration.

"Most often, we will set everyone up in a hotel. It's not a run-down facility, but it's not the Ritz either," Sue Kelly, event staffing coordinator, said. "For longer events, we try to rent an AirBnB home large enough to accommodate all our workers."

The firm also needs experienced, licensed semi drivers to take loads from the Orlando warehouse to events.

provides a sleeper, trailer, and covers all fuel costs.

"It's a great gig for retired truck drivers and we have several husband-and-wife teams who enjoy traveling together," Sue said.

There are more than three dozen events on Scootaround's calendar ranging from two days in length to nearly a month. Events start in January and continue through early November.

"We allow Workampers to choose which events they want to work and how many. We just ask that whenever they commit to working an event that they honor that commitment," Sue stressed. "We have a couple from Arizona who has grandkids in Indiana, so they work the Indiana State Fair every year. They get a tax write-off for their expenses traveling back and forth - and still get to see their grandkids."

Live in the Heart of the Colorado Rockies

Three Rivers Resort & Outfitting in Almont, CO, is a busy, family-owned cabin resort which needs help in its restaurant, accounting office, front desk and activities desk, as well as with maintenance and housekeeping.

The company also owns a 44-unit mobile home park located on-site. Many of the homes are used as summer cottages for retirees who live elsewhere in the winter, Jen Bickford, general manager, said.

"We own 10 of those mobile homes and use them for summer employee housing in addition to 10 RV spaces we make available for Workampers with RVs," she explained. "Typically, our younger college student employees will share the mobile homes, but we have had a few Workampers who lived in them when they don't have an RV."

Most of the time, Three Rivers reserves mobile homes for people who accept the hardest-to-fill jobs, like housekeepers and restaurant workers. However, if Jen really likes someone and has a need for their skills, she will offer them a housing option.

"Housing is at a premium where we are located, so we want to fill all available rooms. We are open to housing solo Workampers as long as they're willing to have roommates of the same sex," she explained. "Generally, we ask Workampers to work full-time hours and commit to the whole season. We charge \$300 per month, per person for housing, which includes utilities."

The resort may waive rent completely for people who accept summer management positions. For example, a couple managing the restaurant for five summer seasons enjoyed their own two-bedroom mobile home at no charge to them.

"This summer, we have a retired couple returning to live in one of the two-bedroom mobile homes. She works in the restaurant and he performs maintenance and groundskeeping," said Jen. "Last summer, we hired a retired couple from Texas who lived in a mobile home and worked full-time in the restaurant. So, we're flexible on who we place in housing depending on our need for positions and the availability of homes."

Live in a National Park

Aramark offers a variety of housing options for Workampers in eight national parks where they work in restaurants or retail stores, rent equipment, fix things, drive buses, mow lawns, checkin guests, clean rooms, and perform dozens of other jobs.

Locations where housing is available nclude:

- Crater Lake National Park, Oregon
- Denali Park Village, Alaska
- · Glacier Bay National Park, Alaska
- Lake Powell Resorts and Marinas at the Utah/Arizona border
- Mesa Verde Nat'l Park, Colorado

While options differ at each location, as a general rule Workampers stay in fully-furnished, dormitory-style housing, although tent cabins are also used at Yosemite and modular homes utilized at Mesa Verde.

A fee is charged for most of the housing, which is assessed daily or weekly and ranges from \$8.50 per day to \$55 per week – all of which is automatically deducted from a Workamper's paycheck. Some locations also offer an employee meal plan with free or discounted dining options.

All the jobs are paid wages that vary depending upon the job, duration, and location. Pets are not allowed and some locations must abide by specific COVID requirements.

"We make housing available for couples and individuals, so everyone should expect to have a roommate," Lindsey Jaroszek, Aramark talent acquisition manager for destination properties, said. "It's great when couples are traveling together."

Some of the locations will have three or four people per room with shared kitchen facilities and bathrooms. Modular homes can house up to six people.

Dozens of Hidden Gems

Identifying employers which make

housing accommodations available is easy to do. Simply look for a house icon at the end of job listings in any issue of Workamper News magazine. Here are some examples of opportunities published since January 2021:

Yellowstone Park Service Stations in Gardiner, MT, frequently advertised positions available for couples willing to work as auto mechanics, retail associates, or both. Workampers also received wages for all hours worked as well as commissions.

Delaware North Parks and Resorts has shared they have housing available for people who want to work in Yellowstone National Park as cashiers, cooks, porters, kitchen helpers, and retail store supervisors. Workampers also get paid, can take advantage of a meal plan, store discounts, and free recreational opportunities in America's most popular national park.

Strates Shows has offered housing to Workampers serving as assistant managers for a traveling carnival office who would oversee computer needs, ticketing and accounting. The firm was also looking for people to serve as office staff, equipment operators, mechanics, drivers, electricians, welders, and ride operators.

Alaska Wildland Adventures offered Workampers housing and \$15 per hour plus free meals for help in outdoor leadership, natural history interpretation, raft or sportfish guiding, hospitality.

cooking, driving, guest services, and maintenance. They were especially looking for people with positive attitudes willing to live and work in a communal, camp-like atmosphere. Some of the lodges can only be accessed by water.

Holt's Guest Resort at Taylor Park, CO, had some housing available for friendly people looking for seasonal full- and part-time paid positions in housekeeping, store, and maintenance.

Jennings KOA near the Florida/ Georgia border offered housing to a couple willing to work six months or year-round performing general office duties, checking in campers, or working in the campground's store or kitchen.

Escape RV Resorts manages four resorts in northern Utah. In addition to housing, Workampers earned \$2,400 to \$4,600 salary per month for work as a camp host or camp manager.

Rainbow River Bungalows was looking for a "rockstar couple" to guide its 22-space mobile home park to the next level. The vacation rental community sought a couple who could multi-task and embraced organic gardening and reusable energy. The two-bedroom, one-bath home needed some tender-loving care, but was available to the right Workampers.

An RV park along the south New Jersey shore was looking for a full-time RV park manager to oversee a 300-unit resort occupied by members who owned RV park-style homes. The resort

catered only to seasonal guests instead of short-term visitors. In exchange for providing handyman work, guest relations, supervising contractors, and managing the property, Workampers had use of a 3- to 4-bedroom, two-bath home with a large yard. They also received a salary and undoubtedly could use all the park's amenities as well.

In Wisconsin, a studio apartment was available for a licensed plumber to work at a short-term project installing plumbing lines at a campground that was also building several studio apartments for use by local residents.

A small family motel in Cody, WY, located about 50 miles from Yellowstone National Park, was looking for a solo Workamper or couple to manage the front desk and do laundry on days they were working. The facility included a furnished apartment that could be rented.

Alpen Rose RV park near Durango, CO, offered a three-bedroom, two-bath residence to a happy, fun-loving, no drama couple willing to serve as a salaried assistant general manager from mid-October to the end of March. Rugged individuals would like working at Maine Forest and Logging Museum in Bradley, Maine, where Workampers could stay in the caretaker's house while they interact with guests, manage a gift shop, and perform other chores around the grounds. The museum is off-grid and operates on solar power.

Lake Creek Youth Camp near John Day, OR, was offering a salary of \$2,500 per month and use of a cabin for someone able to cook for large groups.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers project at John H. Kerr Dam and Reservoir had a house available for volunteers to use when providing 24 hours of service a week by working in gatehouses, performing maintenance, or engaging in interpretive programming.



// Nothing could be finer than to be in Carolina in the morning," are lyrics from a popular song sung by Al Jolson from the 1940s.

What if you could be in the Carolinas every afternoon, evening, and nighttime, too? You can, if you're fortunate enough to land a Workamping job for a season in North or South Carolina. But, even if you're not working, plan to spend some time touring the Carolinas and their famous Outer Banks.

North Carolina: The Tar Heel State

North Carolina is one of the most diverse states in the country. Stretching from the shores of the Atlantic ocean inland to the Great Smokey Mountains and the Nantahala National Forest, the state is home to more than 300 waterfalls. The largest of which is Upper Whitewater Falls, located near Ashville and a few miles from the border with South Carolina. Falling 411 feet, it is the largest waterfall east of the Rocky Mountains.

Less than an hour from the falls, people can still view what was once America's smallest post office. Local residents picked up letters and packages from the 6-by-8-foot Grimshawes historic post office, which was in operation from 1878 to 1953.

The Collettsville Cup House is another unique attraction located in the northwest corner of North Carolina. The little cabin is completely covered in ceramic mugs - as is the fence and just about anything else that can hold a nail. Two artists live in the home, but welcome guests to view the collection and, of course, leave a cup.

Truly adventurous people will enjoy walking across the mile-high swinging bridge on Grandfather Mountain where people are rewarded with 100-mile views. Once a privately-owned tourist attraction, the state park features the highest swinging bridge in America that links two mountain peaks along the Appalachian range. The park also hosts the Highland Games, which celebrates the area's Scottish ties with bagpipes, drumming, dancing, and athletic competitions.














Soft drink aficionados will want to visit The Pepsi Store in New Bern where Caleb Bradham invented the fizzy drink in his pharmacy in 1898 to help customers with indigestion. The store features a museum devoted to Bradham and the drink's popularity around the world. A gift shop offers a variety of Pepsi-Cola books and souvenirs.

While Pepsi may have been invited in North Carolina, the state is well-known for its Cheerwine, the "nectar of the Tar Heels", a cherry-flavored drink produced by the Carolina Beverage Corporation in Salisbury. Cheerwine's claim to fame is it's the oldest continuously-running soft drink company still owned by the same family.

Soft drinks aren't the only thing for which the state is well known. During the Prohibition era, North Carolina was dubbed the "moonshine state" for bootlegging alcoholic beverages. Created in makeshift stills and sold in glass jars, people can still find homebrewed moonshine in many

locations in the Carolinas.

It's been said that some people would crawl over broken glass for a fresh Krispy Kreme donut. In North Carolina, fans can enjoy one or a dozen melt-in-your-mouth treats first created July 13, 1937, in Winston-Salem by 18-year-old Vernon Rudolph. Although the original bakery no longer exists, a plaque at 534 S Main Street in the historic Old Salem neighborhood commemorates Krispy Kreme's humble beginning. People visiting Salisburg can even buy a Cheerwine flavored Krispy Kreme.

America's Largest Mansion

The largest privately-owned mansion in America is the Biltmore Estate in Asheville, NC. Built between 1889 and 1895 by transportation tycoon George Washington Vanderbuilt II, the 178,926-square-foot home is situated on 8,000 acres of immaculately tended gardens.

Listed as a National Historic Landmark, more than 1.4 million people visit the Biltmore every year. The home has 250 rooms, including 35 bedrooms, 43 bathrooms, 65 fireplaces, and three kitchens. A 107-step grand staircase connects the first and second floors.

When the University of North Carolina was founded in 1789 in Asheville, it was the first public university in America. The campus extends over nearly 730 acres. Former President James Polk was an alumnus, as was Andy Griffith, and the university lays claim to being the first radio station to be broadcast over the internet. Basketball legend Michael Jordan played on the Tar Heels team.

Speaking of sports, baseball's homerun king for many years, George Herman "Babe" Ruth, first cleared the bases during a minor league game in Fayetteville. A monument to the slugger inducted into the inaugural class of the Baseball Hall of Fame can be found near the corner of Gillespie Street and Southern Avenue.

While in Fayetteville, play a game of mini golf at Putt-Putt, a course developed by Don Clayton in 1954 which brought skill to the sport of golf and lead to a nationwide franchise creating fun, family entertainment. By adding skill to the game, mini-golf also hones the putting skills of professional golfers.

When many people think of jazz, they may think of New Orleans; however, many jazz greats called North Carolina home, including Bill Taylor, Nina Simone, John Coltrane, Tal Farlow, Tab Smith, Percy Heath, and Thelonious Monk. The North Carolina Jazz Festival pays tribute to those legends with a big event in Wilmington every February.

Looking to spice up your RV with some new furniture? The "furniture capital of the world" is located in High Point, which is a suburb of Greensboro. The High Point Furniture Factory opened in 1889. Today, the city plays host to the High Point Market, the world's largest trade show for the furniture industry. Events in April and October attract more than 75,000 people to view 12 million square feet of showroom space used by 2,300 exhibitors stretched over 188 buildings.

Although the trade show is restricted to people working in the industry, the world's largest furniture store is open to the public. Furnitureland South in Jamestown consists of 1.3 million square feet of displays. If that's not enough options, Furniture Row is an area of the city featuring dozens of furniture stores as well as the world's largest chest of drawers, which towers 36 feet tall and includes two socks dangling from a drawer.

The Blue Ridge Parkway is one of America's most visited national parks. The two-lane undivided highway features 25 tunnels following the Blue Ridge Mountains. There are many pull-offs, rest areas, and scenic overlooks along the highway that extends into Virginia.

If you're in a hurry, you'll probably want to avoid the parkway. But, if time isn't a concern, the slower, meandering roadway is an excellent way to experience the beauty of North Carolina. When traveling along Blue Ridge Parkway, keep your eyes open for flying squirrels.

The parkway directs travelers into the Great Smokey Mountains National Park, the most-visited park in the system attracting more than 14 million visitors annually. The park is home to several popular waterfalls. Hiking and biking trails enable guests to enjoy stunning views without contending with traffic. The Mountain Farm Museum and Mingus Mill preserve historic log buildings used by families a century ago.


Goober and the Gang


Many people may not recognize Pilot Mountain, a distinctive geological shape located 30 miles northwest of Winston-Salem. However, it's very likely they've heard of Mount Pilot, a city frequently referenced by Andy, Barney, Aunt Bea, Floyd, Goober, and the gang from Mayberry.

Actor and singer Andy Griffith grew up in nearby Mt. Airy, which









formed the setting for two popular television shows: The Andy Griffith Show and Mayberry RFD. The community of less than 10,000 people conducts an annual Mayberry Days celebration every September where people can also tour the Andy Griffith Museum to view artifacts from the shows and his life.

The Carolinas Aviation Museum is located at the Charlotte Douglass International Airport in Charlotte. It houses more than 50 military and civilian aircraft, including the U.S. Airways passenger jet involved in the Miracle on the Hudson. The jumbo jet hit a flock of birds shortly after takeoff. The accident destroyed both engines forcing Pilot "Sully" Sullenberger to ditch the aircraft in New York's Hudson River Jan. 15, 2009.

The METALmorphosis in Charlotte is a stunning piece of art. The stainless-steel sculpture was created in 40 layers, each of which spins independently, but come together to form a shiny human head. It sits in a large reflecting pool at the entrance to the 200-acre Whitehall Corporate Center.

The North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences in Raleigh is the oldest in the state and one of the largest in the southeast attracting 1.2 million visitors every year. It contains 1.7 million specimens of plant and animal life and even some out-of-thisworld meteorites. You can't miss the building thanks to a five-story replica of Earth rolled up to the front entrance where the Daily Planet Theater showcases science presentations every day.

South Carolina: Plump Peaches and Mossy Trees

South Carolina is a state as rich in history as it is natural beauty. One of the 13 original colonies, South Carolina was the site of nearly 140 Revolutionary War battles and the state played a big role in the Civil War as well. There are dozens of battlefields scattered throughout the state.

For example, at Cowpens National Battlefield, re-enactors portray the Jan. 17, 1781, battle that was one of Britain's greatest defeats and one of the biggest turning points in America's war for independence. Kings Mountain National Military Park is the site of a battle fought between patriots using rifles and colonists loyal to Britain who favored using muskets.

Years later, South Carolina was the first to secede from the union. Located near Charleston, Fort Sumter is widely regarded as the location of where the first shot was fired to spark America's Civil War on April 12, 1861 when the South Carolina militia fired artillery at a Union garrison stationed on the island. The fort is accessible only by ferry, which operates daily. Tickets include a narrated tour of the harbor as well as a one-hour stop at Fort Sumter National Historic Park.

The state is the second-largest producer of peaches in the United States. It is not unusual to see and hear special agricultural cannons sounding off around peach groves in spring. The instruments work to prevent hail from developing, which could damage the soft fruit. Roadside stands selling fresh peaches and a variety of peach-related treats are common from May through August.

Travelers along Interstate 85 near Gaffney will see the Peachoid, a giant, 1-million-gallon, peach-shaped water tower near the "peach capital of South Carolina." The city is also home to Freightliner Custom Chassis, which manufactures the frames upon which many motorhomes are built today.

Referred to as the Palmetto State, South Carolina is home to

many of the trees which grow to a height of 90 feet and can live more than a century. Starting in April, the state's native magnolia trees begin to bloom showcasing their distinctive 9-inch fragrant flowers. Perhaps the prettiest site is Spanish moss dangling from oak trees throughout South Carolina like tinsel on a Christmas tree to create a mystical atmosphere.

A Golfer's Paradise

Golfers will love Myrtle Beach. The city lays claim to nearly 80 regulation and 30 miniature golf courses and is considered to be the "mini-golf capital of the world."

One of the most famous beaches along the eastern seaboard, Myrtle Beach is popular for ocean access, but also for its beach culture. The "Grand Strand" is a 60-mile long stretch of beach very popular with swimmers, sunbathers, fishing enthusiasts and boaters.

However, the city is also famous for all the activities it offers away from water. With a population of about 36,000 year-round residents, the city has more than 1,800 restaurants needed to serve nearly 20 million annual visitors.

The shoreline is a hive of activity thanks to

the boardwalk and promenade which stretches almost 1.25 miles from end to end. It includes the big Family Kingdom amusement park which features 38 rides, including several roller coasters and a log flume as well as midway-style games. Splashes waterpark across the street features a lazy river and a number of waterslides.

To get a birds-eye view of Myrtle Beach's activity and the surrounding area both day and night, check out the Skywheel attraction. It's a Ferris wheel ride where people sit in one of 42 glass-enclosed, climate-controlled gondolas 200 feet above the boardwalk.

When on the beach, be mindful of two things. First, cars and other vehicles do have access to the beach in certain areas and, second, incoming tides have been known to swallow vehicles and equipment left unattended.

Do the Charleston

A popular Depression-era dance called the Charleston derived its name from the city in South Carolina. The distinctive music was accented by foot movements where people kicked their feet from side to side and crossed their hands at knee level.

Angel Oak is one of the largest and oldest Southern oak trees in the state, if not all of America. Estimated to be between 400 and 500 years old, it stands 66.5 feet tall and its branches extend more than 28 feet. Damaged by hurricanes over the years, the tree still remains one of the most popular tourist attractions in the city.

One of the largest music festivals in America takes place in Charleston over 17 days and nights starting at the end of May. Spoleto Festival USA features more than 150 performances of







well-known and new musicians, vocalists, and dancers. Visitors can enjoy opera, theater, music theater, dance, and chamber, symphonic, choral, and jazz music.

Patriots Point Naval and Maritime Museum allows visitors to climb aboard several big ships, including the USS Yorktown aircraft carrier, USS Laffey destroyer, and USS Clagmore submarine. There are dozens of aircraft on display and a display dedicated to all of America's Medal of Honor recipients.

Middleton Place was once a plantation. Today it is one of the nation's oldest landscaped gardens. Listed as a National Historic Landmark, the house, outbuildings, and 7,000-acre grounds also include hundreds of artifacts depicting life in colonial America through the Civil War. Special exhibits pay tribute to thousands of slaves which helped build and maintain the property.

Hilton Head is a bicycle-friendly island located about 20 miles northeast of Savannah, GA, although cars are allowed as well. With 12 beaches scattered around the island, they are a popular destination as are the natural preserves. However more than two-thirds of island land is now occupied by private residences and huge resorts.

A vast array of wildlife from alligators to sea turtles share the land and nearby waters. From May to October, special patrols are on the watch for nesting and hatching turtles. Local laws prohibit outdoor lights after a certain time because they confuse the turtles trying to make their way back to the ocean. Dolphins are frequent visitors to the Hilton Head area, as are stingrays. The island is also a good launching place for various sport-fishing excursions.

With more than 20,000 square feet of indoor exhibits accented

by 68 acres of outdoor exploration, the Coastal Discovery Center on Hilton Head offers programs and guided tours to help people better appreciate human and natural life in the lowcountry. You can view alligators and seashells as well as learn about how the shipping trade transformed the region.

Outer Banks: A 200-Mile-Long Island Chain

The 200-mile Outer Banks are a string of islands off the coast of North Carolina and part of Virginia. It is one of the most famous shorelines in America, if not the world.

Home to Cape Hatteras National Seashore, the Outer Banks is also known as the birthplace of the first English person born in the Americas. Virginia Dare was born Aug. 18, 1587. Her birth was noted by her grandfather when he returned to England that year.

Since then, her life has been caught up in all kinds of speculation after Virginia and the 107 other people living in Roanoke Colony disappeared without a trace. A monument was erected in the girl's memory on the







north side of Roanoke Island near the Fort Raleigh historic site.

Fort Raleigh National Historic Site, the first English settlement in America founded in 1587, preserves the legacy of the "Lost Colony" and Civil War history. The fort became a refuge for escaped slaves in the 1860s as well as those freed during the war.

People visiting Fort Raleigh can also meander through Elizabethan Gardens, a 10-acre waterfront property featuring more than 500 plant species. Several Renaissance statues are set up throughout garden's well-manicured paths.

The Outer Banks was the site of Orville and Wilbur Wright's first airplane flight at Kill Devil Hills, which took place Dec. 17, 1903 just outside Kitty Hawk. Their aircraft flew 20 feet above the ground for 12 seconds as it covered 120 feet, but the event gave birth to commercial air travel as well as ventures into space.

Wright Brothers National Memorial allows visitors to walk along the historic flight line and read about events on markers depicting the landing sites of four flights that day. Guests can also tour re-creations of the world's first airplane hanger and the brothers' living quarters.

Traveling along North Carolina Hwy 12, people can drive almost the entire length of the Outer Banks with the help of several ferries that transport people and vehicles over open stretches of water and to the mainland. Reservations are recommended for ferry travel and RVs are allowed.

Considered the "Graveyard of the Atlantic," the Outer Banks is home to a museum of the same name in Hatteras. Visitors can learn about the islands' history and view artifacts recovered from shipwrecks along the coast, including a German Enigma machine found

in a sunken submarine. Other displays depict the role pirates played in harassing ships. In fact, noted pirate Blackbeard was killed by British naval forces off the coast of the Outer Banks in 1718.

The Hatteras Island Ocean Center is a stopping point for multiple activities, including kayaking, birdwatching, and a turtle patrol. People can also learn about marsh life while looking for crabs. Guided tours are available during the day and an evening program teaches people about nightlight and the Milky Way while they enjoy s'mores over a campfire.

The Frisco Native American Museum showcases many displays and thousands of artifacts about the people who predated the arrival of European settlers. A nature trail through the woods and marsh overlooks a large pond and the sound.

Cape Hatteras National Seashore is a 70-mile long stretch of land providing lots of recreational opportunities such as hiking, swimming, fishing, biking, paddle sports, surfing, or simply admiring the scenery. There are plenty of places to pull over and enjoy some time on the beach. Off-road vehicles can be a fun way to navigate the sandy terrain, but the National Park Service designated 26 miles of land as being off-limits to ORVs so people can enjoy the natural splendor without contending with vehicles.

The Cape Hatteras light station protects ships from one of the most dangerous sections of America's Atlantic Coast. According to the National Park Services, the Gulf Stream collides with the Virginia Drift, a branch of the Labrador Current from Canada. The current forces southbound ships into a dangerous 12-milelong sandbar called Diamond Shoals, which is responsible for thousands of shipwrecks over the years.

Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge is a nesting, resting, and wintering habitat for thousands of birds every year. It beacons birdwatchers and photographers seeking to capture some colorful images. The refuge is home to 365 species of birds, 25 types of mammals, 24 kinds reptiles, and a handful of amphibians, including a number of endangered species.

HELP YOUR GENERATOR Leep On Lugging by Greg Gerber



any full-time RVers have generators onboard their motorhomes and fifth wheels, but they're often neglected until they're really needed. That's a horrible time to discover the generator is not working.

It's the principle of out-of-sight, out-of-mind. Because generators don't often cause a lot of problems, they usually don't get the attention they need to ensure they're always properly maintained.

When I was full-time RVing, I was under the impression the less I used my generator, the longer it would last without requiring maintenance. I would go months without ever turning on the generator. When I did crank it up, I only did so for a few minutes to run the microwave while stopped at a rest area. Fortunately, an RV technician set me straight.

Generators are sturdy pieces of equipment, but they still need love and attention. The less you use a generator, the more problems you will have – and you won't discover those problems until it's too late. By then, an expensive repair may be needed, or the generator may need to be replaced.

Even if you don't have an onboard generator, the portable systems also need to be regularly maintained. Many of the following maintenance suggestions apply to onboard and portable generators.

Keep It Loaded

The best way to keep a generator in good working condition is to use it regularly, even when staying long-term at campgrounds where you have electrical hookups.

"Once a month, unplug from shore power, fire up the generator and let it run for one to two hours at 50% wattage capacity," John Brown, a generator instructor at the National RV Training Academy in Athens, Texas, said. "Just be sure you don't violate any noise restrictions. But, you have to do more than just turn on the generator. It needs a true workout."

Technicians call this "running under load," which means the generator actually creates power the RV needs to operate air conditioners, televisions, the refrigerator, microwave and other appliances. It's like the difference between sitting on weight-lifting equipment at the gym and actually using it.

So, let the generator huff and puff for a while as it gets a good workout. That ensures the oil and coolant works its way through all the parts for several minutes to keep them well lubricated.

It's even easier to do when traveling. Just turn on the generator and let it run while you're driving down the road while it operates the air conditioners, furnace, and whatever else requires power.

The first time you fire it up, the generator may sputter for a few minutes until it settles into an operating rhythm. It's really no different than a lawn mower or snow blower being used for the first time in several months. That's why a generator needs to run consistently for a while before being shut off.

Keep It Maintained

As mechanical devices, generators still need regular maintenance to ensure they are ready to use when needed. The owner's manual will outline a maintenance schedule to follow. Some items will be based on a specific time interval while others will depend on the total number of

hours a generator has been in operation. For onboard generators, the hours display is often located near the switch to turn it on and off.

Just like a car engine, there are certain things that need to be addressed as part of routine maintenance. Here are the biggies:

Battery

The RV's battery provides a spark to ignite fuel and start the generator. Fifth wheels will have a separate battery for the generator, while motorhomes will tap into the same battery that powers the engine.

Unhook the connections, starting with the black or negative connector, and use a cloth or toothbrush to clean the terminals. If battery acid has built up, use some baking soda and water to help break it down.

Once clean, reattach the connectors starting with the red or positive connection.

"Some manufacturers use cables of the same color, so pay attention when removing the cables so that you can place them back in the same order they were removed," Brown cautioned.

Oil & Filter

Whether or not you use it a lot, the generator's oil needs to be changed at least once a year. If used frequently, change the oil every 150 hours of operation. Oil breaks down over time, which reduces its ability to lubricate properly. Hotter environments, like deserts, can work to breakdown oil more quickly.

"After every eight hours of operating, check the generator's oil levels. A lot can change in eight hours in a small engine," Brown explained.

"By opening the access cover to your generator, you'll have an opportunity to visually see if you have any unwanted campers in your genset, like a mouse or mud dauber," he added. "These unwanted campers tend to build their nests in the cooling fins of your generator, causing inefficient cooling of the engine while in operation."

Consult the owner's manual, but most systems require special oil designed just for generators. At the very least, you should add oil of the same type and weight matching the oil removed when draining the generator. Generally, you want a thinner oil in warmer climates, like SAE 10, and thicker oil in cooler environments, like SAE 30.



The filter should screw out easily. However, if it has been in place for some time, a wrench might be needed to persuade the filter to come loose. Be absolutely certain you use the correct size to maintain the manufacturer's warranty, Brown said.

Fuel Filter & Spark Plug

The generator has a separate fuel filter that cleans gasoline before it reaches the engine. Some generators have two fuel filters, but those are often on older models. A fuel filter is usually changed after 500 operating hours, but, again, consult the manufacturer's recommendations, Brown noted.

Diesel systems don't use spark plugs. But, if you have a gasoline-powered generator, it's a good idea to change the spark plug whenever changing the fuel filter. Depending upon the model, it may have one or two spark plugs. Make sure the gap between the two electrodes is set at the right distance. If the gap is too narrow or wide, it can cause the engine to misfire or operate inefficiently.

"When screwing in the spark plug, consider using an anti-seize compound," Brown explained. "Because the spark plug is made out of steel and the head it screws into is often aluminum, the two different metals will cause electrolysis to occur. The compound will make it much easier to change the spark plug in the future."

If the generator isn't used frequently, you can help extend the life of fuel by adding a few ounces of fuel stabilizer to the tank.

Air Filter

Depending on the environment in which the RV is used, the air filter needs to be changed every 150 to 400 hours. Dusty conditions require more frequent replacement. Remove the filter and bang it on a table or another hard surface. If it still looks dirty to the point light doesn't pass through it, then it's time to change the filter.

Special Tasks for Diesel Systems

Diesel generators have special cooling systems that require the coolant to be changed every five years or 1,000 hours. Unlike oil, you can change the type of coolant after flushing the system. However, as much of the old coolant should be drained from the system as possible.

The exhaust from diesel systems creates condensation that needs to be drained monthly to prevent rust from forming in the generator. Water has a tendency to form inside the system as well, which means it needs to be drained every few months for the generator to operate at peak efficiency.

If you're uncomfortable performing maintenance on the generator by yourself, most mobile RV service technicians will be able to do it for you. The RV Technician Association of America maintains a map showing the location of trained and certified members. It can be found at www.rvtaa.org/locate.

Easy Ways to Improve Your Workamper Resume



ere at Workamper News, we have the opportunity to see a lot of Workampers' resumes. Thousands of Workampers every year use our step-by-step Resume Builder tool (available to our Diamond & Platinum members) to help them create a resume geared towards the Workamping adventures they seek.

Even though our Resume Builder makes this process much more simple than just starting with a blank page, there is still the opportunity to stumble a bit if not enough care is taken.

Here are 3 easy ways to help your resume work better for you:

1. Space It Out

In our Resume Builder, one of the sections is called "Sell Yourself." Here, Workampers are encouraged to describe their objective, share their skills and experiences, provide some personal details, etc.

Over the years, we've read some fabulously-worded text, but it is all ran together in one big paragraph. Even though everything may be spelled correctly and the grammar done to perfection – it's an overwhelming block of text that an Employer may take one look at and think…"I ain't reading all that."

Break it up a bit:

- Keep your paragraphs to about 2-4 sentences
- Have defined sections with section headers
- Instead of long sentences depicting abilities/ skills, go with a bulleted list
- Didn't that make this part stand out and easier to read?

2. Proofread

This may seem silly to mention, but it's an oftenoverlooked step! Once you feel like you're "done" with your Workamping resume, please be sure to give it a thorough read.

You don't want your resume to accidentally say something like, "I may not have much Workamping experience, but I don't bring a lot of other skills to the table." Wait, what?

Be sure to double-check that your contact information is correct. We've had some Workampers believe their resume was unsuccessful because they were not receiving any responses, but the crux was they had a type-o in their email address so emails from Employers were not coming through.


3. Get Feedback

Send your resume to a few friends or family members and have them read through it to find any snafus, plus give their opinion on its readability. They may see things that you do not.

There may also be something that, as-written, makes total sense to you, but not to others – especially if it includes lingo from a specific industry.

Sometimes it is difficult to "toot our own horn." Someone who knows you will be able to give suggestions on adding in traits or qualities that just didn't come to your mind or you felt self-conscious about including.

BONUS TIP! If you are a 2-person team with one resume that includes details on both individuals, please be sure to either write in the third-person (John has experience with... Jane was a...) or designate who the subsequent information is referring to (John: I have experience with... Jane: I was a...). This will ensure the reader knows what information on the resume applies to which Workamper.


